



MISSION

Inform the IU Indianapolis campus and wider community of learners through our educational resources, technologies, and expertise.

Connect people with our resources, our services, and each other.

Transform the lives of our community members by facilitating discovery, creativity, teaching, learning, and research. The University Library actively partners in the transformation to new and more accessible formats.

A leader among academic libraries, the IU Indianapolis University Library offers the campus and community technologically advanced services, specialized instruction, and diverse study spaces for individuals and groups. The library focuses on leveraging technology to support student success with 28 full-time librarians, and a Center for Digital Scholarship. The library is the primary informal learning space on campus, and continues to update technology, offer distinct study spaces for different types of learners, and create innovative services for our patrons.

- The IUPUI University Library becomes the <u>IU</u> <u>Indianapolis</u> University Library.
- IU Northwest, IU Kokomo, IU Indianapolis and IU Southeast were named in the top tier by Third Way in its annual Economic Mobility Index report for the campuses' strong return on investment in 2023.
- IU Indianapolis University Library was a 2024 recipient of *Insight Into Diversity* magazine's Library Excellence in Access and Diversity Award.
- 715 people voted in the November 2023 and 250 in the May 2024 elections at the Marion County voting center housed in the University Library.
- The second annual Libraries & Literacy Symposium had over 100 attendees learning about civic literacy through workshops, presentations, panels, and a traveling exhibit.
- In 2023-2024, library staff answered 5,387 reference questions from students.
- Our librarians provided 316 instructional sessions and 601 research consultations.
- Records for 40,003 titles were added to the catalog for the Books on Demand program. There are now over 161,000 titles available in the program.

COLLECTIONS AND INFORMATION ACCESS

The IUI University Library serves over 27,000 undergraduate, graduate, and professional students in Indianapolis, Fort Wayne, and Columbus. IUI, IU Fort Wayne, and IU Columbus serve a full- and part-time campus teaching staff of over 7,000 faculty, librarians, academics, clinicians, and staff who teach. All can access electronic serial titles, e-books and databases online at any time.

The University Library and Herron Art Library together hold almost 2 million titles and provide access to over a million e-books and e-journals, and hundreds of databases. Government documents are now available primarily <u>online</u>. IUI continues to be a congressionally designated depository for U.S. Government documents, participating in the <u>Federal Depository Library Program</u> since 1979.

Digital Collections

IUI's institutional digital repository, <u>ScholarWorks</u>, shares over 40,000 articles, posters, reports, theses, educational materials and historical documents submitted by members of the campus community in order to address research communities' need for new outlets in scholarly communication.




IUPUI 1960s IUI Digital Collection

ScholarWorks contains 40,833 titles in 2023-2024. The library works to make as many of these articles that are authored by faculty, staff, and students openly accessible so that anyone with internet access can read them without a subscription.

Since 2013, the IU Indianapolis Open Access Fund has supported faculty, postdoctoral, and student authors publishing in fully open access, fee-based, peer-reviewed journals. With support from many IU Indianapolis schools and other key stakeholders, the fund has assisted

in the publication of <u>more than 200 articles</u>. Along with the <u>IU Indy Open Access Policy</u>, this fund has been a factor in <u>IU Indianapolis's national reputation</u> for sharing scholarly works at no cost to readers in Indiana and around the world. University Library's digital collections averages 40,600 page views/month from 913,310 items in CONTENTdm. This year our collections were segregated from the Indiana State Library collections. The entirety of our collection is now separate from ISL's site.

VISITORS

The University Library serves thousands of patrons from the general public. Indiana residents over the age of 18 are eligible to apply for a borrower's card, and teachers with a valid school ID or business card may borrow an extra audio-visual item for teaching purposes under the guest borrower program. Our guest users can check out materials; use computers, software, and wireless internet; access our research databases; and use our printing/photocopying services, as well as reference assistance.


CIRCULATION


The University Library circulates thousands of books and other materials each year, and IUI users are able to renew items online. Undergraduate students may borrow up to 50 items. University staff and graduate students can borrow 125 items. Faculty can borrow up to 500 items. All users must return audio-visual material within 14 days. Other items, such as


calculators, phone chargers, wireless presentation remotes, dry erase boards and markers, board games are also available for short time frame loans.

Interlibrary Loan

Materials requested through Interlibrary Loan (ILL) come from a network of local, national, and international libraries. Working in a largely virtual environment, over the past academic year the University Library accessed 10,867 books, films, and articles for users via this shared network and supplied 8,982. Most articles are delivered within 8 to 48 hours, with over half delivered in under 24 hours.

Participating in the international ILL ecosystem as both a borrower and lender is a key part of University Library's patron-driven collections model. In the 2021-2022 academic year, UL Resource Sharing supplied 232 articles via on-demand services, and added 161 books (96 ebooks and 65print) to the University Library collections via the ILL Purchase on Demand program.

EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

<u>Teaching librarians</u> at University Library collaborate with instructors to teach undergraduate and

graduate students in every major, department, and school. Librarians incorporate diverse educational approaches to engaging learners in classroom instruction through technology online and in-person, at the information desks, during research consultations, in programming and displays, and through student employment.

University Library has 29 librarians, 15 of them serving as subject liaisons to serve specific schools, departments, and programs to support the teaching, learning, and research needs of faculty and students in these areas. https://iu.libguides.com/librarians

INFORMATION SERVICES

Librarians, staff, and student employees at the Services & Information Desk answer thousands of reference questions. Additionally, <u>subject librarians</u> conduct in-depth one-on-one research consultations for students and faculty via telephone, chat, e-mail, in-person, and via zoom on all aspects of the research process such as choosing a topic, determining information needs, finding resources, and evaluating and citing those sources.

LIBRARY SPACE AND TECHNOLOGY

With over 300 computer workstations, the library *informs, connects*, and *transforms* the lives of students through leading-edge technology. In the 2120 Learning Lab, students learn to navigate electronic resources, and the fourth floor Rich Media area gives them the tools to produce high- end multimedia projects in a collaborative environment.

On the fourth floor, the library has a <u>3D Printing Studio</u> where students, faculty, and staff can work with a library 3D modeling expert in using MakerBot Replicators, MakerBot Digitizer, MakerBot 5th Generation printers, LulzBot 3D printers, Makerbot 3D scanners to design and create 3D teaching aids, research projects, and coursework.

The library also boasts a <u>Virtual and Augmented Reality Lab</u> with 3 XR development desktop PCs, 15 Meta Quest 2 headsets, 2 HP Windows HMDs, a suite of XR development programs, and suite of Meta Quest 2 apps. The VR Lab currently supports the VR Speech Program in


Student Group Study Room Usage



Student Employment Program (STEP)


The library's many undergraduate and graduate student employees fulfill vital roles across a range of departments, from providing frontline user services and technology help to

working on 3D/VR initiatives and supporting ScholarWorks. With 47 students working in the library, representing 9 schools and 25 different degree programs, we continue to be one of the largest employers of students on the IUI campus. The Ruth Lilly Special Collections & Archives, and our Client Support (technology) units have the most student employees.

The Student Employment Program provides on-going training, resources, and support for supervisors of student employees. The long-term goal is to provide all University Library student employees with a work environment and experience that focuses on engaged learning, fosters a sense of belonging, and supports students' personal, academic, and career success.
