IUPUI University Library



Mission:

Inform the IUPUI campus and wider community of learners through our educational resources, technologies, and expertise.

Connect people with our resources, our services, and each other.

Transform the lives of our community members by facilitating discovery, creativity, teaching, learning and research. The University Library actively partners in the transformation of information to new and more accessible formats. A progressive leader among academic libraries, the IUPUI University Library offers the campus and community technologically advanced services such as rich media technology, 3D printing, PC/MAC specialized software, librarian chat, live tech assistance, as well as specialized instructional space. The library focuses on leveraging technology to support student success with 29 full-time faculty librarians, plus programs in information literacy and digital scholarship. With millions of library database downloads each year, the library's resources are always available to students. The library is the primary informal learning space on campus, and continues to update technology, offer public and private individual and communal learning spaces, and create innovative goods and services for our patrons.

- In 2018-2019, the University Library named the founding Herbert Simon Family Dean of University Library at IUPUI: Kristi Palmer.
- The University Library was nationally recognized with the *SirsiDynix Power of Libraries Award* for our annual "I Heart UL" outreach program, an informal assessment effort that gives students a voice in library operations and directly impacts the library's institutional effectiveness, collections and space management. Findings from the annual assessment effort enable us to make changes in space and services to better meet the needs of students and make the library a welcoming place for all learners.
- University Library serves thousands of undergraduates, graduate, and professional students. In 2018-19, library staff answered over 2,000 reference questions, in-person and online.
- Last fiscal year, librarians provided 1230 instructional sessions and research consultations, making contact with over 9,000 students.
- Last year the University Library had 827,881 visitors including university students and faculty members, conference attendees, and community users. In the process of serving the Indianapolis community, the library issued 158 borrower's cards in 2018.
- In the last five years, <u>IUPUI ScholarWorks</u> has multiplied by more than five times from 2,609 items at the beginning of 2013 to 20,060 items today.
- The University Library currently supports 21 <u>open access journals</u>, from fields of community based participatory research, health, social work, and more. Five new OA journals were added in 18-19. OA journals have had 273,266 views this year alone.
- The Leiden Rankings for Green Open Access (repository-based open access) practices place IUPUI at 79th world wide and 21st in the United States in 2014-2017.
- The National Service Archives was launched in 2019 to collect the records of individuals and organizations involved in AmeriCorps, Peace Corps, and the promotion of national service and volunteerism. More than 123 cubic feet of new materials related to national service have been added to the collection since its launch.
- The library's new Student Employee Program (STEP) continues to engage our 66 undergraduate and graduate student employees who work as circulation desk supervisors, circulation desk clerks, computer technicians, digital scanning assistants, mailroom clerks, and interlibrary loan clerks. 92% of library student employees report that working in the library improved their marketable job skills.
- A Seed Library was started in the summer of 2019 to address food insecurity and educate the community on gardening and seed saving. In its first month, 87 students, staff, faculty, and community members checked out seeds.
- University Library supplied 21,820 items to patrons through IU Request Delivery, Interlibrary Loan, and Article Delivery Services, filling 95% of requests.

COLLECTIONS AND INFORMATION ACCESS

Open over 100 hours each week during regular semesters, the IUPUI University Library serves over 20,000 undergraduate students and over 8,000 graduate and professional students, with the largest incoming class in IUPUI history! We serve a full- and part-time campus teaching staff of over 6,000 faculty, librarians, specialists, resident appointees, and research fellows. All can access over 80,000 electronic serial titles and thousands of eBooks and databases online at any time.

The University Library and Herron Art Library together hold over 1 million titles and provide access to 1 million unique ebooks, 145,000 e-journals, and over 500 e-databases and online collections.

Digital Collections

In 2018, IUPUI's digital archive, IUPUI *ScholarWorks*, had 241,170 downloads, 264,484 abstract views from 190 countries. 3,052 IUPUI articles were published that year. The Herron Library added 2,624 items to the library's digital collections. The collections had 29,757 page views. They produced three new <u>digital cultural heritage collections</u>: <u>Harry A. Davis</u>; <u>Indiana Landmarks Central Canal Collection</u>; and, the <u>Herron</u> <u>School of Art and Design Book Arts Capstone Exhibition Experience Collection</u>.

Archives & Special Collections Digital Repositories:

- Ruth Lilly Special Collections and Archives' eArchives has had 41,955 cumulative visits/views (4,396 views in 2017-2018) with access to 8,959 items.
- Foundation Literature Online/FOLIO had 50,876 cumulative visits/views (1,659 views in 2017-2018) with access to 1,268 items.
- Philanthropy Resources Online/PRO has been viewed 20,556 times (3,219 this year), providing access to 544 multipage items.

VISITORS

The University Library serves thousands of patrons from the general public. Indiana residents over the age of 18 are eligible to apply for a borrower's card, and teachers with a valid school ID or business card may borrow an extra audio-visual item for teaching purposes under the guest borrower program. Our guest users can check out materials; use computers, software, and wireless internet; access our research databases; and utilize our printing/photocopying services, as well as reference assistance.

CIRCULATION

The University Library circulates thousands of books and other materials each year, and students are able to renew items quickly and easily online. Undergraduate students may borrow up to 50 items for 45 days. Faculty can borrow up to 500 items for 120 days; and university staff and graduate students can borrow 125 items for 120 days. All users must return audio-visual material within 14 days. Other items, such as calculators, phone chargers, data cables, wireless presentation remotes, portable DVD drives are also available for short time frame loans.

Interlibrary Loan

Materials requested through Interlibrary Loan (ILL) come from a network of local, national, and international libraries. Over the past academic year, the University Library accessed nearly 21,000 books, films, and articles for users via this shared network and lent another 18,000+. Most articles are delivered within 8 to 48 hours. Sharing materials with other institutions allows the University Library to leverage its resources by delivering information on demand.

In 2019, *InstantILL* was made available to users, a service that gives users rapid, easy access to any article, at any time, and at no cost; it presents already available content, whether through subscription or Open Access, to users. After the project's announcement in spring 2019, over 200 libraries contacted Open Access Button to get more information/join InstantILL's waiting list.

The University Library provides services to freshmen, including Themed Learning Communities and the Summer Bridge programs for incoming students. Librarians provided 360 classroom visits for IUPUI courses, in addition to online research guides and tutorials.

INFORMATION SERVICES

Librarians, staff, and student employees at the one-point Services & Information Desk answer thousands of reference questions. Additionally, <u>subject librarians</u> conduct in-depth one-on-one research consultations for students and faculty by telephone, chat, email, and in-person on choosing a topic, determining information needs, finding library resources, finding internet resources, and evaluating and citing those sources.

LIBRARY SPACE AND TECHNOLOGY

With over 350 computer workstations, the library informs, connects, and transforms the lives of students through leading-edge technology. In the 2120 Learning Lab students learn to navigate electronic resources, and the fourth floor Rich Media area gives them the tools to produce high- end multimedia projects in a collaborative environment. Five of our group study rooms are specialty multi-media production rooms outfitted with powerful computers and video editing equipment. All public PC stations are outfitted

with *Jaws 17*, screen-reading software for blind and low vision students, and 76 stations are outfitted with *Kurzweil 300*, text-to-speech software for English language learners, students with learning challenges, and low vision students.



The library has a 3D Printing Studio where students, faculty, and staff

can work with a library 3D modeling expert in using MakerBot printers and 3D scanners to design and create 3D teaching aids, research projects, and coursework. The studio had 245 individual 3D print projects, a 67% increase from last year. The library also boasts a Virtual and Augmented Reality Lab, which had 850 visits from students and faculty, and 100 visits from community partners. This year, 147 individual VR experiences and projects were launched in the lab, with the School of Engineering and Technology and the School of Science recording the highest levels of engagement with this new library service.

Eight of the 35 group study rooms at the library were refreshed this year. These rooms average 88% occupancy during peak library hours, and in 2018-2019, had 33,317 bookings.

The University Library has 42 reservable student group study rooms managed through an online reservation system that is accessible for vision-impaired students. These reservable rooms include 16 small, 10 medium, 11 large rooms, and 5 rich media/video production rooms. In 18-19 study rooms were in use for more than 73,000 hours, making more than 33,000 reservations.
